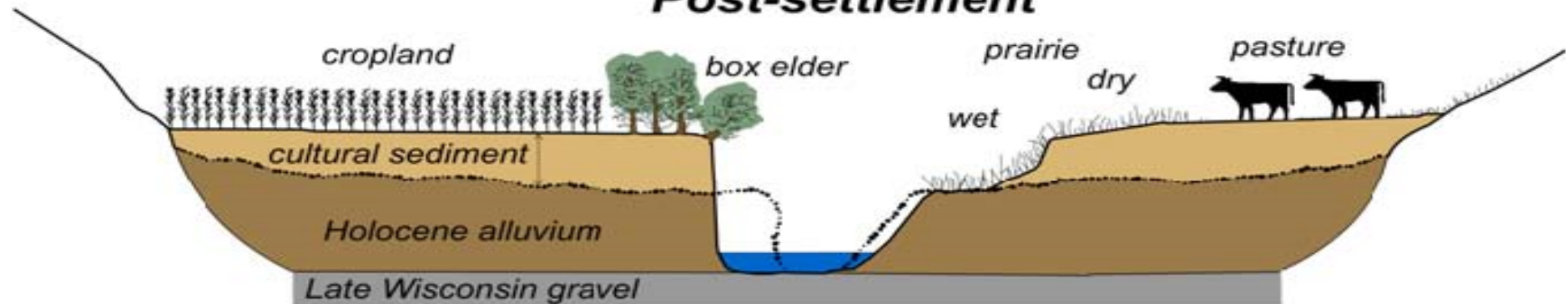

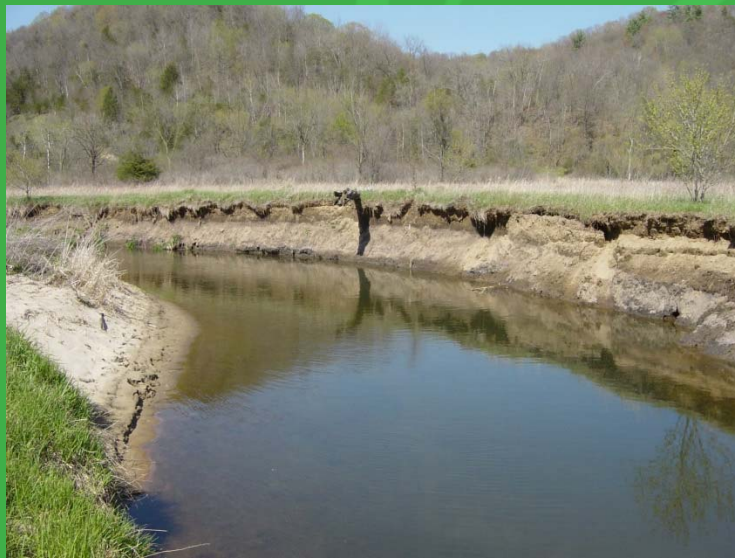

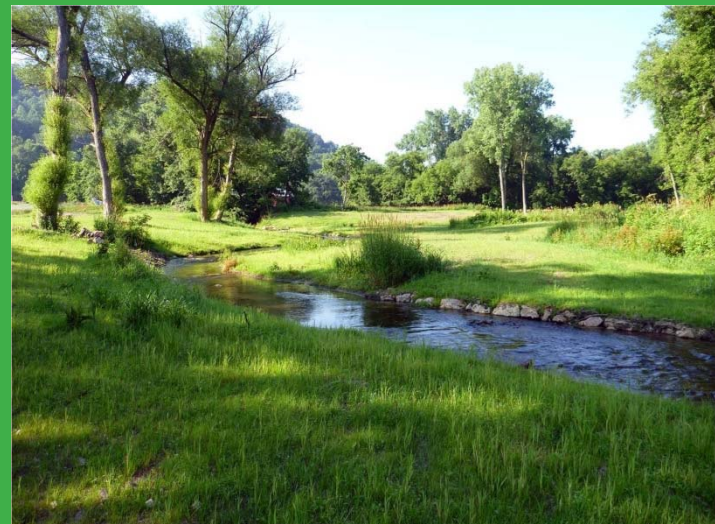

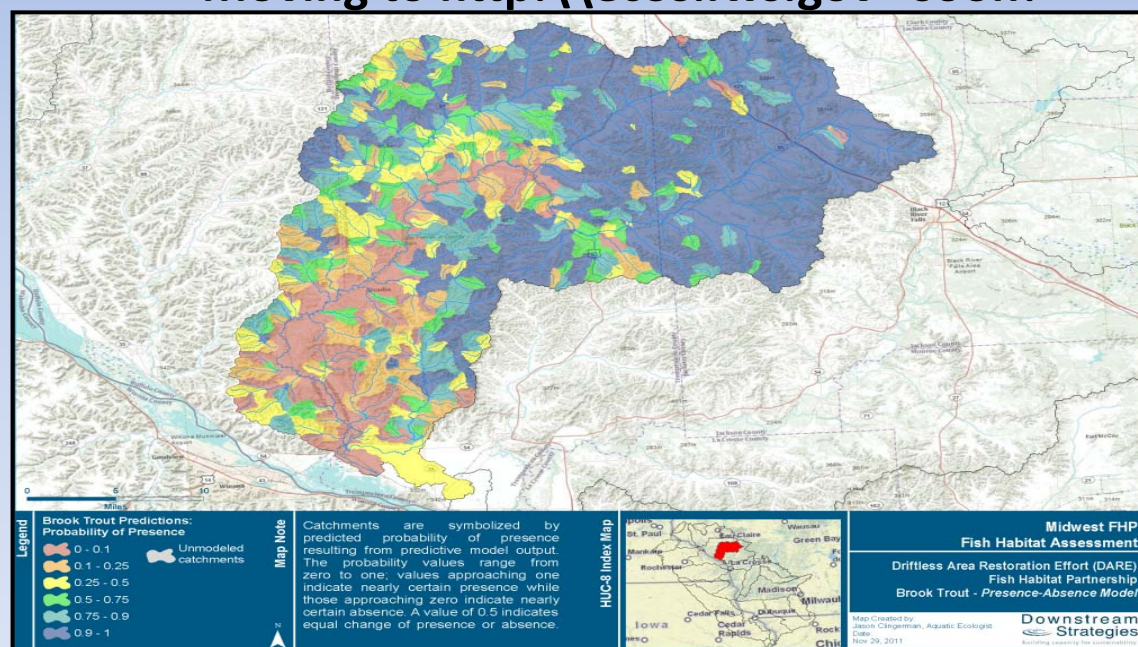


Fish Habitat Decision Support Tool

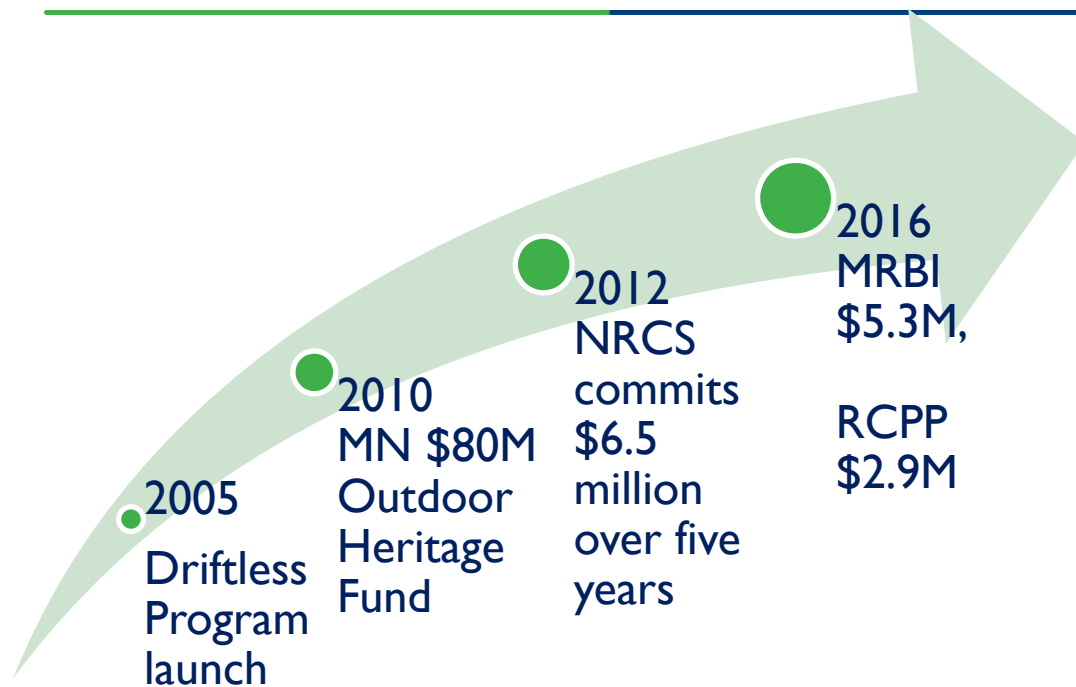
